SIX Exchange Regulation AG publishes decision with grounds regarding delisting of secondary listed Gold Fields Limited, Sandton (South Africa)

Gold Fields Limited has announced, that all of its secondary listed registered shares (Swiss Security Number 803'185 / ISIN ZAE000018123) with a nominal value of ZAR 0.50 each will be delisted from SIX Swiss Exchange. SIX Exchange Regulation AG has granted the companies' application on 28 August 2019.
